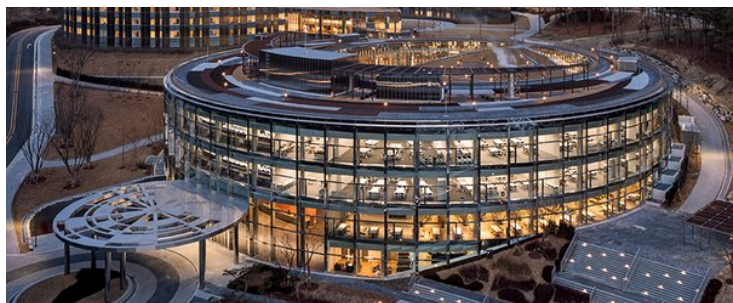


Korea uses Life Park as COVID-19 treatment centre
