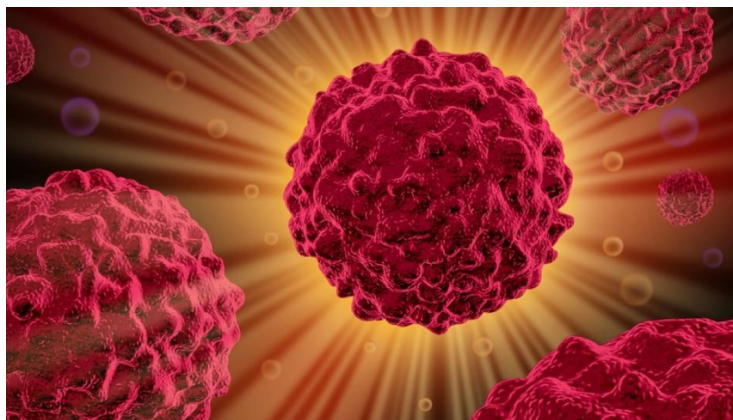


Samsung Biologics teams up with BioEleven for cancer immunotherapy
