He pointed out that Asia-Pacific, being the fastest-growing region in healthcare spending, is on the verge of becoming a key player in global health innovation. By 2030, the region is expected to account for over 20% of the world's healthcare expenditure, presenting unparalleled opportunities for the integration of AI in medicine and healthcare systems.
