"This MOU is expected to significantly expand practical opportunities for exchange and collaboration between Korean and US biotech companies," said Dr Seung-Kyou Lee, vice president of KoreaBIO. "We hope that this partnership will closely link the bio-innovation ecosystems of both countries and accelerate their entry into global markets."
