

Korea begins operating healthcare industry damage support centre in Middle East

Existing tariff damage support centre expanded as of March 6 in response to escalating tensions in the Middle East



The Ministry of Health and Welfare (MOHW) and the Korea Health Industry Development Institute (KHIDI) have begun operating the Healthcare Industry Damage Support Centre on Friday, March 6.

Since April 25, 2025, the MOHW has operated the Biohealth Industry Tariff Damage Support Centre within KHIDI, the government's dedicated health industry agency, to help strengthen the competitiveness of Korean biohealth companies and minimise damage caused by US tariff measures.

As the deteriorating situation in the Middle East is expected to affect Korean biohealth exporters and medical institutions operating in the region, the MOHW has expanded and relaunched the centre as the Healthcare Industry Damage Support Centre to mitigate the impact on Korean companies and provide swift assistance.

The Support Centre will operate in close cooperation with relevant ministries, such as the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Resources (MOTIR) and the Ministry of SMEs and Startups (MSS), as well as related organisations, including the Korea International Trade Association, the Korea Trade-Investment Promotion Agency (KOTRA, which operates the Emergency Response Desk for the Middle East Crisis), the Korea Trade Insurance Corporation, and the Export-Import Bank of Korea.

Jung Eun-young, Director General for Health Industry Policy, stated, "In close cooperation with relevant ministries, including the MOTIR and the MSS, as well as related organisations, we will continue to monitor the challenges facing Korean biohealth export companies and medical institutions operating in the Middle East and provide robust support to minimize the impact."
